Part B. CV SUMMARY

Cristina Corredor is since 2021 Associate Professor at the Department of Logic, History and Philosophy of Science of the National University of Distance Education (UNED). Before that, she held the same position at the University of Valladolid (UVa). She has specialised in philosophy of language, particularly in pragmatics and speech act theory, and in argumentation

theory. Part of her work focuses on the role that communicative interactions play in the determination of the meaning and force of utterances. From a pragmatic-normative perspective, she has studied some types of speech act and speech uses, including promises, irony, presumptions, advocacy, accusations, and certain argumentative uses of language, like deliberative dialogues and acts of dissent.

She has a steady trajectory of services to the profession. She is presently coordinator of the UNED Doctoral Programme in Philosophy. Between 2018 and 2024 she chaired the board of directors of the Sociedad Española de Lógica, Metodología y Filosofía de la Ciencia en España (SLMFCE). She was vice-dean of academic organisation, and of international relations and mobility at the Faculty of Philosophy and Arts, UVA (2010-2016); deputy director of the Escuela Internacional de Doctorado, Universidad de Valladolid (2017-2018); and local coordinator of the Inter-university Doctorate Program in Logic and Philosophy of Science (2019-2021), among other numerous academic positions. She also belongs to the editorial committee of the journals *THEORIA* (2013- present, Scopus Q2) and *RIA* (2008- present). Finally, she regularly participates in the evaluation and revision of research projects and articles and takes part in scientific and academic assessment committees. To mention but a few relevant examples of the last years, she has held the following positions: evaluator of research projects for the National Science Centre, Poland (2020); expert evaluator of the Posgraduate Fellowship called for by the La Caixa Foundation (2022, 2023) and its INPhINIT Programme (2024, 2025); and member of other numerous scientific committees. She has also been frequent expert evaluator of research projects for ANEP, MINECO (first) and MICINN (more recently).

As part of her academic supervision activity, she has had the opportunity to guide the work of many students for them to finish and defend their final theses, and so to achieve the levels of bachelor's degree, postgraduate studies and doctorate.
