Part B. CV SUMMARY

I obtained my PhD in 1988 from the University of Barcelona, where I got a chair in 2001. I am also an invited professor in Lisbon since 2012. I have published about 200 research articles, many of them in Q1 journals, including the very best in my field such as *Mind*, *Journal of Philosophy*, *Noûs*, *Philosophy and Phenomenological Research*, *Philosophical Studies*, *Synthese*, *Philosophical Quarterly*, *Australasian Journal of Philosophy*. I have published 2 monographs, and have four more under contract. They are not compilations of papers, but independently structured book-length discussions, these four monographs put together my main original contributions to philosophy. *Tell Me What You Know* (OUP, 2024) articulates and defends my account of assertion as an act regulated by enforced constitutive rules, governed by a social epistemic norm. *Indexicals and the First Person* (Springer, 2025) presents and argues for my Fregean account for the reference of directly referential expressions like names and indexicals on which Fregean senses are reference-fixing presuppositions. *Representing Oneself* (OUP, 2026) defends and account of the first-person concept in terms of reference-fixing presuppositions that involve acquaintance with reference-fixing token reflexive acts, and thus with oneself, which explains Cartesian data and its *Immunity to Error through Misidentification*. Finally, *Truth and Reference in the Making of Fiction* (CUP, 2024) articulates my constitutive-norms account of fictionalizing and fictional representations. I have also co-edited 6 compilations for OUP, and another one for Continuum. I have visited for extended periods the departments of philosophy at Stanford, MIT, Oxford, NYU, Edinburgh, Lisbon, IIF-UNAM and IJN-Paris. I am in the editorial boards of *Theoria*, *Crítica*, *Disputatio*, *Dialectica*, *Anuari*, *Manuscrito*, *Thought* and *Linguistics and Philosophy*, and I am editor of *Noûs* since 2016 (top philosophy journal in a recent metaranking, (*Synthese* 202, 188, 2023)). I have been member of evaluation panels for many research agencies, including the AEI, AQU, UNIBASQ, ERC (four calls panel SH4, ERC AG), the Research Councils of Czechia, Norway, Poland, Portugal and Finland. I have supervised 22 PhD dissertations, and mentored 20 postdocs, most of whom obtained academic positions and became successful professional philosophers. I created in 1995, and initially chaired the LOGOS group

(http://www.ub.edu/grc_logos/). With help from Catalan institution ICREA, we hired international researchers like Genoveva Martí (previous coordinator), Carl Hoefer, Max Kölbel, Pepa Toribio, Dan López de Sa and Sven Rosenkranz (current coordinator). We have been participating in an interdisciplinary PhD program *Cognitive Science and Language* (<http://www.ub.edu/ccil/?q=en>), which I contributed to create in the early 1990s, and which I coordinated for a few years in the past. In 2009, we started the PhD program in Philosophy *Analytic Philosophy* (<http://www.ub.edu/aphil/?q=en>), which I coordinate since then. I was the principal investigator in a successful application for an ERC ITN Marie Curie FP7-23812 (1.465.432,00€) *PETAF: Perspectival Thoughts and Facts*, 2009-2013, the first philosophy network to secure such funding, including in addition similar groups in London (Institute of Philosophy), St. Andrews (*Arche*), Aberdeen (*NIP*), Paris (*Institute Jean Nicod*), and members of the philosophy departments of Stockholm, Geneva, and CEU-Budapest universities (my colleague Sven Rosenkranz has been coordinating the project afterwards). We obtained funding for another ITN, coordinated by Sven Rosenkranz, one of whose 6 WP I led (H2020-MSCA-ITN-ETN -2015 675415 *Diaphora*, 3,670,853.76€). I was the principal investigator for the project *PERSP* (2.000.000€), one of the 72 projects in all fields granted inside the framework of the 5-years CONSOLIDER-Ingenio schema by the Spanish Research Council, and the only one in philosophy. I was one of the six “investigador garante” in the recently granted María de Maeztu grant CEX2021-001169-M (2.000.000€) for *BIAP*, first in Humanities. I received the prestigious five-year ICREA Academia Award, granted by an international committee, in the first 2008 call, renewed in 2013 and 2018.
